How to Make French Toast

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






























Our visit to the Water Purification Centre

Last week we went to visit the water purification centre, and we found out some interesting, weird facts:

What makes the water dirty?

The 3 main things that make the water dirty are:

- baby wipes
- soap
- oil

How do they clean the water?

Those 4 things above make 3 layers: the sand at the bottom, then the water and at the top the baby wipes, soap and oil.

To separate them they use a big machine that sucks up all the sand and with a big iron rectangle board and they scoop out all the oil, soap and wipes then the water, goes to another pool full of microbes and germs that will eat all the dirt and make the water more cleaned, the sand will be excavated and put in a hole, and the oil, soap and wipes will be burnt. Sometimes there is too much water and as the machines can't clean it so it gets all put in a river were people swim and drink off.

What can we do to help?

- do not throw baby wipes down the toilet
